## Amendment to the club and intramural sports manual:

Any student who has been identified as one who has sustained a concussion or any student who exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion (such as but not limited to loss of consciousness, headache, dizziness, confusion or balance problems) shall be immediately removed from the activity and shall not return to play in any Competitive Sports activity until cleared by an appropriate licensed healthcare professional providing official written documentation.

- a. On-site personnel (players, coaches, spectators, etc.) are not considered to be appropriate licensed health-care professionals unless officially acting in that role (i.e. scheduled Athletic Trainer under Orders, or Team Doctor).
- b. The State of Nebraska defines a licensed healthcare professional as a qualified as an individual who (a) is registered, licensed, certified or otherwise statutorily recognized by the state of Nebraska to provide health care services and (b) is trained in the evaluation and management of traumatic brain injuries among a pediatric population. Examples include but are not limited to...
  - a. A Physician
  - b. A Licensed practitioner under the direct supervision of a physician
  - c. A Certified Athletic Trainer
  - d. A Neuropsychologist

Official written documentation must be submitted to the Assistant Director of Competitive Sports or their designee. These can be submitted in person or via email (<a href="recreation@creighton.edu">recreation@creighton.edu</a>). Return to play will be granted on the discretion of the Assistant Director of Competitive Sports or the designee upon receiving documentation clearing the participant to return to play.
